

Districtwide Environmental Permit/NEPA Compliance Monitoring Services

DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

This indefinite deliverable/indefinite quantity contract provides Districtwide environmental compliance monitoring of construction or maintenance projects for compliance with permit, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documents, and other Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) commitments. All projects associated with this contract are located within Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties.

CECOS was the prime consultant for this contract. Services performed typically involve: NEPA and permit compliance inspections and reporting, permit expiration tracking through construction, archaeological monitoring oversight, wetland delineation, wetland mitigation plan development, wetland mitigation monitoring, regulatory agency coordination, listed species protection, and Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) reviews.

As construction projects occur throughout the

aforementioned counties, numerous environmental permit conditions and NEPA compliance commitments apply. Wetland boundaries vs. limits of construction, archaeological monitoring, listed species protection, staging areas/staging adjacent to sensitive resources (such as wetlands and historic structures), water quality, erosion control/SWPPP are some of the construction components that require monitoring as part of this contract. Our role as the FDOT District 6 Permit and NEPA Compliance Monitor provided CECOS with unique insight for Project Development and Environment Studies and Final Design because monitoring previous commitments allowed us to proactively coordinate with FDOT on future commitments regarding their implementation during construction.
